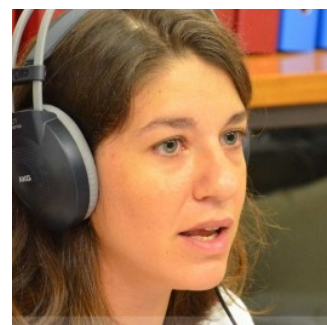




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Dimou Nassia received her diploma in Greek Philology, with specialization in Linguistics, from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. She received her Master's diploma (DEA) in Experimental Phonetics from the University Paris 7 (in collaboration with the University Paris 3) and her Doctoral Degree in Experimental Phonetics from the University Paris 7 on: «L'identification d'une langue a partir des indices suprasegmentaux.
